at the new church.

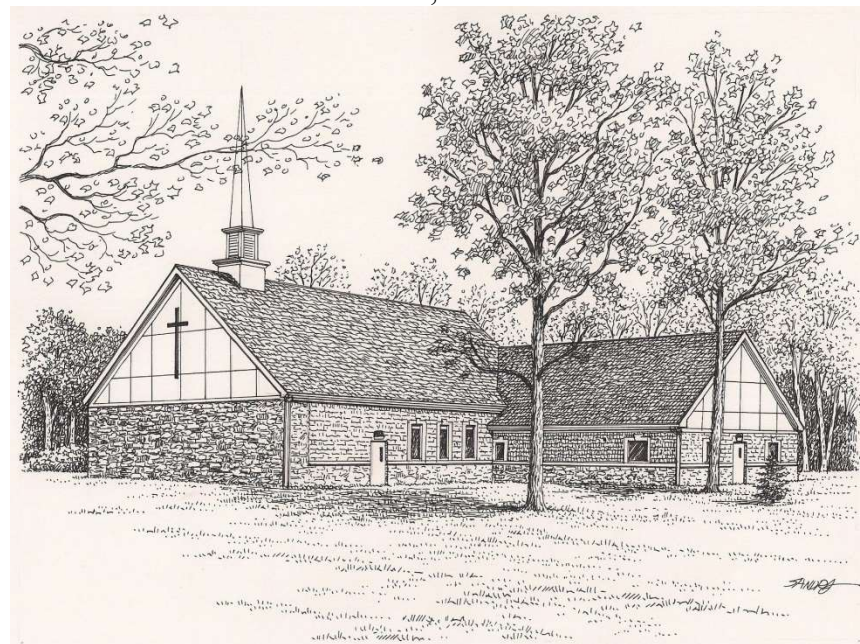
Choir is meeting on September
