**Café Compassion** is a free breakfast open to the community and served the 1st Saturday of the month year round from 8:30am to 10:30 am at the new church.


**Choir** is meeting on September 8 and 29<sup>th</sup> for ½ hour practices. Plan to join them and make some beautiful music.
