

Zion Lutheran Church Council Meeting 5/13/2025 6 p.m.

**Present:** Sue Davila, Jerrri Hisey, Marv Middeton, Sally Middleton, Chad Root, Jodee Shaw and Pastor Karen Strietelmeier. Absent: Chris Harrison

Vice President Marv Middleton opened the meeting with a prayer.

**Secretary's Report:** Sue Davila moved to accept the March report. Sally Middleton seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously..

**Treasurer's Report:** Jerri Hisey presented the March and April reports. The 2025 budget remaining at the end of March was \$111,218.18. The budget remaining at the end of April was \$99,426.64. Total assets at the end of March were \$128,241.06. Total assets at the end of April were \$136,403.36. Offerings received in March were \$13,247.00. Jerri said there were no large expenditures during the two months. She noted she is still waiting for the final bill from Chime Masters for the new Bell Tower. Jodee Shaw moved to accept the two reports with Sue seconding. Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Karen reported she attended a joint Lutheran and Episcopalian Chrism Mass and Renewal of Ordination Vows at the Cathedral of Saint James in South Bend on April 10. She made two home/hospital visitations in April and early May. She attended the monthly Saturday breakfasts and greeted attendees at the front door in April and May. Pastor also attended the Pavillion meeting on May 8. Pastor said the Lenten season went well at Zion, noting both the adult and children's choirs performed at the Good Friday and Easter services. Pastor thanked music director Becky Goodman and all of the singers for their participation. She also thanked all those Zion members who served behind the scenes throughout the season. Pastor added the Zion Easter Egg Hunt attracted approximately 20 children who collected more than 1,500 eggs filled with candy. Pastor said she began a Sunday Worship Program titled "The Lord is My Shepherd" that will run through June 1. Pastor reported she held a new member class on May 4 and welcomed into fellowship Lynn Williams, Jodee Shaw, Linda Hebels and Sherry Sigsbee on May 11. Sherry was also baptized at that time and Bella, Zion's faithful canine attendee, received an honorary fellowship. On April 1, Pastor officiated at the funeral of Jill Tevlin who lost a heroic battle with cancer on April 4. Pastor reported she will be on vacation from May 31 through June 12 and that Becky Goodman will preach on June 1 and 8.

#### **Ministry Areas:**

**Long-Range Planning:** As Chris Harrison was absent, there was nothing reported.

**Fellowship:** Sue reported that in addition to the Easter Egg Hunt and Easter Breakfast, Zion held a Cookies and Canvas Event that was attended by 30 women and children. Sue said she is pleased by the turnout and that the participants appeared to have a great time. Following this event, the church hosted a Euchre Party that was part of the annual Hunger Auction. Sue announced Vacation Bible School will be held June 15 to June 19. Jerri added that 62 Zion members have signed up for the South Bend Cubs Game outing in August.

**Worship & Music:** Marv announced that now that the Bell Tower is completed, carillon music can be added to Sunday worship services when appropriate. Pastor Karen said she will let the music director know this as Becky is the one who chooses the worship music.

Personnel: Chad Root had nothing to report.

**Social Ministry:** Sally Middeton said Zion's June mission will be Bashor's Children Home.

Property: Marv reported the church's furnace filter was changed this past week. Dave Vanzile then spoke on behalf of the Pavillion Committee. He reported Zion has a quote for construction of a pavilion for approximately \$40,000. This includes a metal roof and soffits, concrete floor and wood posts. The size would be 26 by 40 feet with a 9 foot height. Dave reported this cost does not include the excavation, permits or electrical. He added he believes Zion members can take care of the excavation and permits. He stated the pavilion would be built near the playground. Dave asked for permission to bring the request to the congregation. Jerri noted Zion already has \$17,000 designated for the pavilion. She added the remaining funds will require fundraising and/or additional donations from Zion members. Chad asked if the committee obtained additional quotes. Dave said no. Chad said he will look online into obtaining additional numbers. Jodee moved to allow the Pavillion Committee to bring the issue to the congregation. Sue seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. It was determined the Pavillion Committee will speak to the congregation following the May 25 worship service.
