

Zion Lutheran Church Council Meeting 7/8/2025 6 p.m.

Present: Sue Davila, Chris Harrison, Jerri Hisey, Marv Middeton, Sally Middleton, Jodee Shaw and Pastor Karen Strietelmeier. Absent: Chad Root.

President Chris Harrison opened the meeting at 6 p.m. Secretary Jodee Shaw offered the devotions focused on how sometimes it feels like we're living in darkness, but that when we call upon God, he provides us with light, or sometimes even a hug.

Secretary's Report: Sally moved to accept the June report, with Sue seconding the motion. The motion passed unanimously...

Treasurer's Report: Jerri Hisey presented the June budget. The 2025 budget remaining at the end of June was \$76.590.75. The total assets at the end of June were \$122.9811. Offerings received in June were \$14,650. Jerri reported the Bell Tower is paid in full. She said Zion saved approximately \$14,000 due to refunds received due to the breaking of the bell itself. Sue moved to accept the report with Jodee seconding. The motion passed unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Karen listed her June activities, including volunteering at Vacation Bible School, attending the Young at Heart luncheon and the Cafe Compassion breakfast, and meeting with a prospective member. Pastor reported she also met with the head librarian at the Bristol Public Library to discuss how Zion can collaborate with or volunteer there. Pastor said the library is hosting a car show on August 16. Pastor and Sherry Sigsbee will staff a craft booth there to promote Zion. Additional volunteers are welcome. Pastor reported the new church secretary, Lesley, will be working Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Any information that needs to go into the church calendar or online should be directed to Lesley.

Ministry Areas:

Long-Range Planning: President Harrison said the Pavillion Committee is working to obtain a quote for electrical service. She said the builders want to contract out the excavating work. Chris said the committee is also looking into the purchase of heavy picnic tables that cannot be moved once set into place. She reported a vote of the congregation determined the pavilion will be built between the playground and the shed.

Fellowship: Sue had nothing to report.

Worship & Music: Pastor said the Bell Tower dedication is scheduled for September 15. She also stated she would like to see the Outreach and Evangelism committees focus more on intergenerational ministry. She said Zion's aging community needs to recruit families and 20 somethings into the congregation. Pastor said in order to do this, Zion needs to become more visible in the community and online. In addition to the booth at the Bristol Library car show, Zion will have a display at the Bristol Back to School event on August 12, where the school supplies and backpacks will be handed out. Pastor said it would also be nice to be seen at the annual Corn Dog Festival on September 6. Pastor said church volunteers will be needed to staff these events.

Personnel: Chad Nothing to report.

Social Ministry: Sally Middleton said Zion's August mission will be an organization that provides hot, nutritious meals to victims of recent catastrophes, such as the flash floods in Texas. She is researching several faith-based organizations to determine which will provide the best service.

Property: Marv said there are several Maple trees along C.R 19, adjacent to the cemetery, that are old and dropping branches. He said three Zion members have agreed to chop down the trees.

Finance & Audit: Mary had nothing to report.

Nominating: There was nothing to report.

Cemetery: Marv reported the Cemetery Committee has opened up 50 of the 186 plots to Elkhart-area Lutherans who are not members of Zion. They will be charged \$600 for a single plot or \$1,200 for a double. Marv stated this is the normal price for a plot in Indiana. The cost for Zion members is \$300 for a single and \$600 for a double. Marv said historical research shows that Zion is selling an average of 3 plots a year.

Christian Education: Sue had nothing to report.

Technology: There was nothing to report..

Pastoral Advisory: Sally had nothing to report.

Old Business: Sue reported that Vacation Bible School went very well. She noted there were plenty of volunteers to serve the 35 participants. Marv noted the online VBS musical program had 30 views.

New Business: Jerri said the next social activity is the South Bend Cubs baseball game on August 22. Chris asked what the congregation can do to recognize Sharon for her many years of service to Zion. The council decided the church will send her a thank you card and a gift card. As there was no other new business, Jodee moved to adjourn the meeting. Sally seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
